

THE STATE OF GUN VIOLENCE IN VIOLENCE IN

Gun violence poses a serious public safety risk to Virginians, claiming the lives of 958 residents each year and wounding even more. Lawmakers owe it to their constituents to pass strong gun safety laws immediately.

GUN SUICIDE

- Nearly 67% of gun deaths in Virginia are suicides, and nearly 57% of all suicide deaths in Virginia involve firearms.
- From 2013 to 2017, 3,200 people in Virginia died by gun-related suicide. That's one every 14 hours.

URBAN GUN VIOLENCE

- Gun violence has a disproportionate impact on urban communities of color.
- Black men make up less than 10% of Virginia's population, but account for nearly 61% of the state's gun homicide victims.
- In Virginia, black men ages 18–24 are nearly 25 times more likely than white men the same age to be murdered with a gun.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- · Guns make domestic violence incidents far more likely to end in death.
- Nearly 63% of Virginia's intimate partner homicides involve a gun.
- From 2007 to 2016, 197 women were killed with a gun by their intimate partner in Virginia.

YOUNG PEOPLE AND GUNS

- Exposure to gun violence can cause lasting trauma in young people, leading to PTSD, chronic stress, and decreased future earnings.
- From 2013 to 2017, 926 people under age 25 were killed with a gun in Virginia.
- Guns are the leading cause of death for Virginia children ages 1–17.

PROVEN SOLUTIONS TO PREVENT GUN VIOLENCE IN VIRGINIA

Virginia has relatively weak gun laws and is a major source of guns exported to other states and used in crimes. To save lives from gun violence, lawmakers in Virginia must take action to require background checks on all gun sales, ban large-capacity ammunition magazines, require gun dealers to obtain a state license, fund urban violence reduction programs, and enact an extreme risk protection order law, which removes guns from people at risk of harming themselves or others.
